

Sports Grant Statement 2016/17

For the academic year 2016-17, Alfred Street Junior School received a grant of £9,000.

This grant will be used to improve the quality of the PE provision within our school whilst ensuring that we provide a legacy of sustainability; to engage pupils in a range of sporting activities; to take part in a range of competitive sports and to encourage pupils to lead healthier lives.

Our main aims for this year are:

- To improve staff confidence in the delivery of PE – through ‘Real PE’ Training and working alongside coaches.
- To improve the quality of teaching in swimming for all teachers and increase water confidence and achievement in the pool.
- To increase the fitness of all pupils
- To enable pupils to take part in a range of sporting activities and competitions
- To increase participation in competitive sport and healthier activities
- To deliver ‘Young Leader Training’ to increase sporting opportunities within the school day.

We intend to use the funds in the following way:

To give children training in preparation for festivals through ‘Premier Sports’.	£1,350	Increased participation in sport during the school day. Increased confidence of pupils when taking part in sports not taught in school.
To provide access for our pupils to quality extra-curricular activities, through ‘Premier Sports’. To engage all pupils in taking greater responsibility for doing regular physical activity. To train pupils to become young leaders in the delivery of ‘The Golden Mile’ initiative.	£4,800	Improvement in the quality and diversity of extra-curricular activities e.g. handball, archery, gymnastics, fencing, football, multi-skills - Targeting children attending; who would not normally access this provision. Golden mile initiative being run by young leaders and all pupils within the school participating at some level.
To employ an extra swimming instructor throughout the year to support staff in the delivery of swimming and to decrease the number of children unable to swim at least 10m.	£900	Staff expertise in the teaching of swimming increased and expertise used to reduce the number of children unable to swim at least 10m – target 100% by the end of the key

		stage.
To join with schools in the cluster to pay for the work of Martin Smith, who is responsible for organising cluster festivals and competition and for the hiring of venues.	£350	Participation in a range of competitive sporting activities.
To provide resources for a range of sporting/health activities, including transportation costs to attend festivals.	£1,000	Children will have regular opportunities to participate in physical exercise and enjoy physical activities.
Real PE Training for staff across the school.	£500	Staff confidence raised in the delivery of PE across the school and having a better grasp of assessment in PE.
Young Leaders Trained and supporting the delivery of PE during recreational time.	£100	Playtime and lunch time opportunities increased and more children engaged in planned activities by the Young Leaders.
